
Training Needs Analysis

Up and Coming

In April 2008 the National Core Content resources (e.g. electronic journals available nationally, Dialog databases, Images MD, electronic books etc) will change. There will be a new search interface, users will be accessing databases via Ovid instead of Dialog and a more focussed set of electronic journals tailored specifically for community, mental health and primary care staff.

During this period of change, the Library and Information Services will continue to provide training and support to ensure that all West Sussex PCT staff are informed of the new developments. Searching for Healthcare Information: Training Programme January - March 2008

Venue: Your workplace, or Crawley Hospital Library, at a time convenient to you.

• **Healthcare Information & Literature Searching**

Aim:	Learn to search for journal article abstracts or citations using quality health databases, including Medline, BNI, CINAHL, PsycINFO & DH-Data, plus over 1,000 full-text journals.
Good For:	Evidence-based practice, research, audit, or guideline writing. Databases for all disciplines, including medical, nursing, psychology/psychiatry, the therapies, and health management. Requires some Internet experience.
KSF Dimensions:	IK2, IK3, G2, HWB1, HWB4, HWB5, HWB7

• **There's more to the Internet than Google!**

Aim:	Learn to find quality web pages and search useful websites, such as the National Library for Health (the NHS gateway to healthcare information) including specialist libraries for primary care.
Good For:	Useful websites. Literature and information searching novices.
KSF Dimensions:	IK2, IK3, G2, HWB1, HWB4, HWB5, HWB7

• **Searching the Cochrane Library**

Aim:	Learn how to use the Cochrane library (a collection of evidence-based databases). Search for systematic reviews and current clinical trials.
Good For:	Clinical effectiveness research. Requires Internet experience. Not ideal for information searching novices.
KSF Dimensions:	IK2, IK3, G2, HWB1, HWB4, HWB5, HWB7, Core 4

• **e-Resources 'Grand Tour'**

Aim:	Take a 'grand tour' of the diverse online resources provided nationally and locally by your health library. Gain an overview of which resource specialises in which type of question and subject area, with a focus on primary care.
Good For:	Confident Internet users who want to know what is out there for them.
KSF Dimensions:	IK2, IK3, G2, HWB1, HWB4, HWB5, HWB7
